## **Meet with a Business advisor regarding your application:**

Students must complete three Business prerequisite courses with a minimum 2.0 GPA to utilize School of Business Drop-in advising in UW1-381. See [website](#) for hours.

## **If all the following are true, you are ready to apply:**

- Prerequisites** are done or one of the following is true:
  - 3-4 pending courses while apply for Autumn admission (summer quarter pre-req in-progress okay)
  - 2 pending courses for Winter or Spring admission
- Writing Assessment Options:** WSA is completed or have equivalent (see "WSA" below)
- 60 completed credits (80 preferred)
- 2.5 minimum cumulative GPA (see "Am I competitive" below)

- For Bothell, minimum of 3.0 average prerequisite GPA.

## **Notes on Options/Concentrations in Business:**

- Accounting Option: must earn a 2.5 in each B BUS 210 and B BUS 211 and at least a 3.0 average of these two accounting courses
- MIS Concentration: recommended to take both CSS 142, and CSS 143 or CSS 173 while Pre-Major status
- Supply Chain Management (SCM) Option: 3.0 or higher in calculus and statistics, or at least a 3.0 average in those two courses and a 3.0 or higher in B BUS 340 (taken while in the major)
- Eastside Leadership Center (ELC): UW Bothell offers a Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration degree at our Eastside Leadership Center (ELC) in Bellevue.
